On 26 April 2002, in the German city of Erfurt, 19-year-old Robert Steinhäuser entered his former high school with two semi-automatic weapons and killed 17 people. On the tenth anniversary, a writer visited Erfurt to research the event for a play.

Kate Rice (writer *Sweetest Things* – nominated Best Play 2013 Australian Writers' Guild awards) imagines what happened, what might have happened, and the meaning of the Erfurt school shooting.
